According to the Montana Mold Disclosure Act, all inhabitable properties contain mold, which includes mold, fungus, mildew, and spores. Moisture contributes to mold growth, and moisture is all around us. There are many different types of mold and certain strains of mold may cause damage to property and may adversely affect the health of some people. Reactions may occur causing allergic responses that could include such things as skin, eye, nose, and throat irritation, infections, and even life-threatening diseases. Not all health care experts agree about the nature and extent of problems that may be caused by mold exposure.


